KEYNOTES

Extremely Small Choices that Make a Surprisingly Big Difference with Chris Roland

Abstract: This is a very practical talk that looks at how small adjustments to whatever task we are doing, be it a speaking activity, an exercise from a book or worksheet or even just a list of vocabulary we are revising, can result in a greater level of learner uptake and a very different feel in the classroom.

We shall cover primary ages and tweens and teens and pay particular attention to tweaks that require either very little planning and preparation, or none at all. This is the stuff that comes for free, as it were, which you can decide to do in the moment and that will improve engagement, productivity, recall, classroom dynamic and morale.

The suggestions will also help you cover your coursebook or syllabus more easily and will be doable with larger groups and in classes where movement may be restricted. Suitable for newer teachers, seasoned veterans and trainers alike. You will go away with handfuls of micro-strategies to try out.

About Chris Roland

Chris Roland is a teacher, trainer, ELT author and 'ideas man' based in Seville. He has worked in Spanish mainstream education and the private academy sector and held positions with the British Council in Barcelona and in Damascus. He considers himself an all-terrain 4x4 teacher and trainer, covering all levels and age ranges, including teenagers and young adults, general English, exam preparation and Business.

He has published a number of methodology books including Understanding Teenagers in the ELT Classroom (2018), which was a British Council ELtons finalist, and Structuring Fun for Young Learners (2020), with additional titles to help teachers transition to online teaching. He has also produced a variety of supplementary material for well-known course book publishers.

Chris works with teachers on intensive methodology and language development courses, and tutors on the Trinity Diploma and Cambridge DELTA. Known on the conference circuit for his lively and practical talks, he is particularly interested in classroom dynamics, the lesson as event in itself, personalising language tasks, and how we can help our learners remember key words and phrases.
