




# Museum

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# Scilla

**Scilla is a beautiful town in the province of Reggio Calabria**

-To get there from Reggio you have to take either the train or the car. The journey is approximately 20 mins.

-Once you arrive (especially if it's summer)the first thing to do is to swim in the sea. Scilla has amazing, crystal clear water and often crowded beaches.

-In winter Scilla is not very popular, however in the summer there's no day when there aren't people there. The beach is filled with bathing establishments and all the restaurants are full of people

-Scilla is a known for its castle (which overlooks the sea and is one of the symbols of the city) and also for the statue of Scilla e Cariddi (two ancient monsters of the Greek mythology)





# “Aragonese Castle”

The **Aragonese castle** of Reggio Calabria is the main fortification of the city, located in the square of the same name, ‘Castello’ between via Aschenez and via Possidonea.

→ **DATE OF CONSTRUCTION:** between 536 and 549 A.D. by the Byzantines of Belisario.

★ The structure still retains its historical charm.



- ❖ The building currently hosts art and photography exhibitions and cultural events.
- It’s quick and easy to get here as it is to the center of Reggio.



Ticket price: € 2 full, € 1 residents.



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
# Gambarie

# The Duomo of Reggio Calabria

**Reggio Calabria Cathedral** is located in the historic centre of the city and overlooks Piazza Duomo.

The first appearance was in the second millenium, then the Cathedral evolved and has been rebuilt several times.

Construction began in 1917 and the works ended in 1928. The architect was Carmelo Angelini and he designed the Duomo in *Roman-Gothic style* to resume the origin.

Recently, at the Cathedral, the Diocesan Museum was opened which contains sacred objects. It contains some fragments of the first Cathedral, dating back to the 18th century.





## CORSO GARIBALDI

- Corso Garibaldi was built in 1783, and is the main street of the city.**
- The Corso starts in De Nava Square (in front of Museum of “Magna Grecia”) and ends in the Garibaldi Square, in front of the train station of the city. It is 2 kilometres long.**
- During the trip, you will see a lot of beautiful places, such as:**
- The S.George church**
- The municipal theater with the civic art gallery**
- The Cathedral**
- And Piazza Italia, which is the most important square**
- There are too a lot of restaurants and fast food.**





# PIAZZA ITALIA

- Piazza Italia was built between the 16th and 17th century
- In ancient times, in this place were elected the 3 mayors of the city
- It's located in front of the Prefecture
- The original name was "Piazza Vittorio Emanuele II", but was changed because of the Italy Monument that was built 140 years ago
- Under the square are the remains of the ancient city, which go back at the Greek period.
- In the square area there are also a lot of shops and a place that you have to visit, the café "Fragomeni", where you can try delicious shakes.
