An anthropomorphic wood plank who holds a baseball bat. [18][19] Although considered part of Italian brainrot, it has Indonesian origin. [15] The "Tung Tung Tung" in its name is onomatopoeia of how Indonesians traditionally beat *kentungan* slit drums to commence *suhur*, the pre-dawn meal that Muslims eat before fasting during Ramadan. [19] The word *tung* also means "rumbling" in Sundanese, spoken in Indonesia. [20] @noxaasht originally made the character in February 2025, and it has become its own meme outside the context of Italian brainrot. 



How it works:

- Wait for Gemini to generate your storybook.
- 4. Once it's ready, you can:
 - Download it as a PDF
 - Listen to the audio narration
 - Share it as a link
 - Or make changes to the story by giving Gemini new prompts.

Good to know: You can even upload photos of your family, pets, or a favorite place, and Gemini will turn them into a story with matching illustrations. It also works in other <u>languages</u>, just write your prompt in the one you want.
